

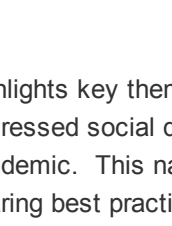

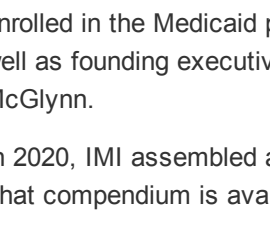

Save the Date -- Compendium of Innovation During the Pandemic Release Event: June 27, 3:00-4:00 PM, eastern

Mark your calendars! IMI's Compendium of Innovation During the Pandemic will be released in conjunction with a national event on Monday June 27, 2022, from 3:00 - 4:00 pm Eastern Time. With support from the Episcopal Health Foundation and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the release event highlights key themes from Medicaid managed care organizations' (MCOs) innovative initiatives that addressed social determinants of health and health inequities exacerbated during the COVID-19 pandemic. This national webinar will feature a moderated panel of community and health plan leaders sharing best practices, lessons learned, and ideas on how to sustain innovation after the pandemic. CDPS + Rx Project Update: ICD-10 Codes Crosswalk Available

IMI continues to lead work in partnership with UCSD to update the CDPS + Rx model. As we continue this work, an updated ICD-10 code crosswalk that includes 191 ICD-10 codes that will be included in the updated CDPS + Rx model, but that were introduced after releasing CDPS + Rx version 6.5, is available to all CDPS + Rx users with a current license. 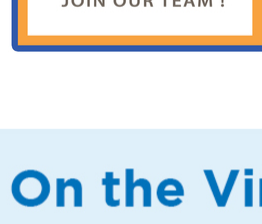

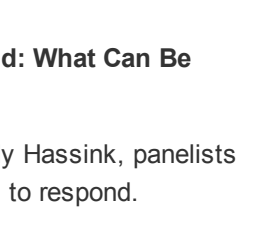

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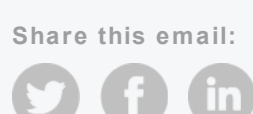
