Join the Institute for Medicaid Innovation for an interactive virtual learning series that will introduce midwives to fundamental concepts related to Medicaid and business. Throughout the series, participants will have access to resources and expertise that will strengthen their ability to form a case to advance birth equity in Medicaid through business goals and initiatives.



What is included?

- 15 monthly, 1-hour salon-style, online learning sessions
- Interactive content and Q & A with national experts
- Pre-session activities to enhance participation (approximately 1 hour/month)
- Supplemental resources and tools

What is a salon-style learning session?

Salon-style learning sessions bring together thought leaders and change agents to engage in open conversation and group discussion. Discourse between participants and invited speakers will be the foundation of each session to promote knowledge expansion and idea generation.

- Business Plan Risk Assessment, Mitigation, And Program Evaluation

- Revolutionary APM design: Upending How Traditional Maternal Care is Delivered
- Action-Oriented Planning: Key Elements of an Implementation Plan

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Who should participate?

The learning series is designed for midwives of all certifications including CNM, CPM, CM, LM, and midwifery students who want to learn the skills necessary to develop a data-driven Medicaid business case. The series will be limited to 50 individual midwives or midwifery practices to encourage open conversation and promote networking opportunities. Interested midwives or midwifery practices will complete a brief application that will assess applicants' readiness to learn and ability to apply business case tools. Priority criteria for selection include:

- Geographic location to support distribution across the U.S.
- Practices or individual midwives currently serving or have the potential to serve a community with a significant proportion of Medicaid enrollees.
- BIPOC midwives/midwifery practices led by a BIPOC individual and/or serving a predominantly BIPOC community.



Is there a cost to participate?

There is **no cost** to participate. However, to secure a spot in the learning series, participants must be selected through the brief application process and **commit to completing all 15 learning sessions**, including pre-session activities. **A total of 2-hours/month will be required.**
