IMI and the [Aspen Institute](#) will host a Medicaid Policy Summit September 28–29, 2023 in Washington, D.C.

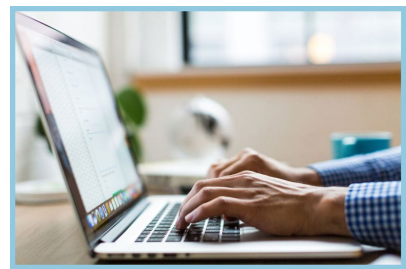
