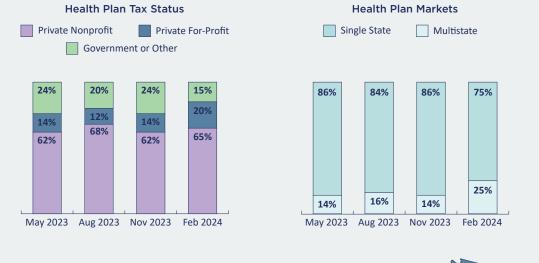
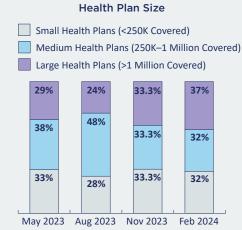


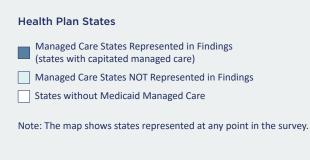
Redetermination Survey Trends Across 2023-2024: Capturing the Impact of Redetermination

Demographics

The findings from the redetermination survey series represent health plan data from almost every state with Medicaid managed care. The Institute for Medicaid Innovation's primary goal is to equip stakeholders with the information they need to accurately articulate the national narrative about redetermination in Medicaid managed care. The four surveys were fielded approximately every three months, from May 2023 through February 2024.



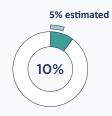

of health plans had 0-5% of their members disenrolled



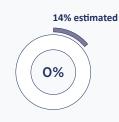

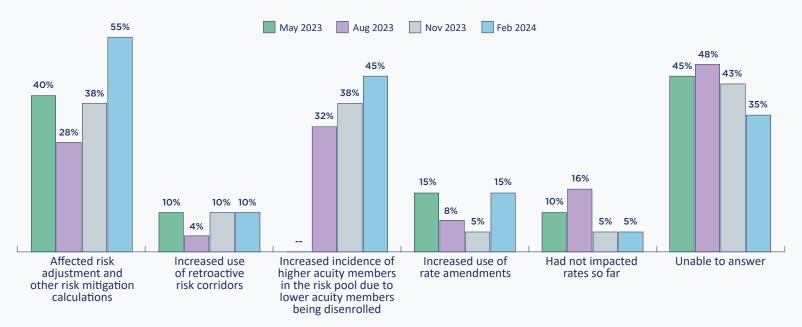

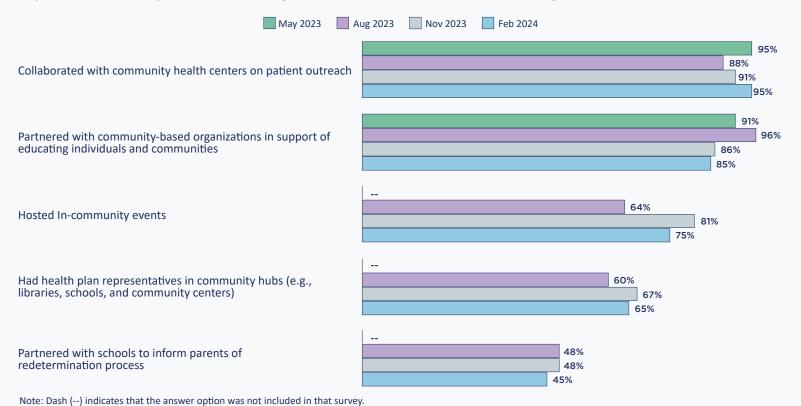

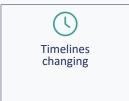

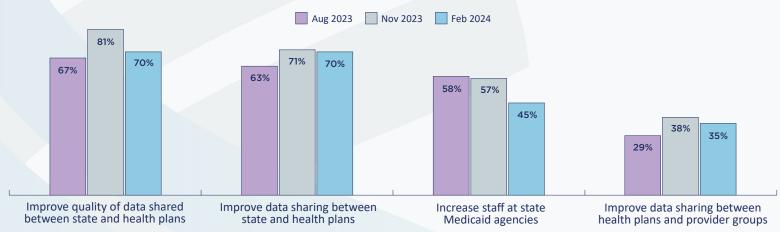
Medicaid Health Plans Used a Variety of Strategies to Assist Members in Completing Renewal Forms*
